The Goat Classes are held under the Rules, Regulations and Recognition of the British Goat Society, Gibshiel, Tarset, Hexham, Northumberland, NE48 1RR. All Exhibits must be registered with the British Goat Society as in the ownership of and in the name of the exhibitor, the registered name, number and ear mark being quoted on the entry form, together with that of the Sire and the Dam, also the kidding dates of Goats in milk. All Goats in milk must have kidded or aborted a minimum of 30 days prior to the day of the Show.

Any kid exhibited must not be less than 2 calendar months of age on the day of the Show. No pregnant goat may be admitted to the Showground. If there is a kidding or abortion, this must be reported to the Chief Steward. The registered number of any Goat initially entered as RAF must be submitted to the Show Organisers before the Goat competes. All entries must be accompanied by a CAE negative whole herd certificate issued during the previous twelve months and current at the date of the Show. All goats must conform to the current regulations regarding identification, all earmarks and tags must be readable.

Goats in milk must be on the Showground by 5.30 p.m. on Friday 18th August 2017 for milking out at 6.30 p.m. Goatlings and kids must be on the Showground by 8.30 a.m. on Saturday 19th August 2017

PENNING - please indicate on your entry form which category is required to enable the correct penning to be provided. **ENTRIES CAN ONLY BE ACCEPTED FROM WHOLE HERD TESTED HERDS AND MUST BE ON THE OFFICIAL BGS CAE FORMS (FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN YOUR ENTRY BEING RETURNED)**

Exhibitors are requested not to bring to the Showground any goats that have ever had a positive reaction to CAE test and that milk produced at shows should not be fed to goats of any age.

This Show is open to goats on the Scrapie free Register.

EXHIBITION RULES

1. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor and carry the correct number and must be in the charge of an attendant who will be required to conform to any regulations council deems expedient to enforce.
2. Where sketch card numbers are used instead of earmark numbers, then these must be brought to the show along with the animals for identification purposes
3. All prize winning animals must be paraded in the Grand Parade or owners will risk forfeiture of prize money at the discretion of the Stewards.
4. Any animal winning a prize(s) at the show and subsequently found to be ineligible shall be disqualified.
5. The Judge's decision shall be final and Council reserves the right to withhold any of the prizes offered if, in the opinion of the Judge(s), the exhibits do not possess sufficient merit.
6. Any member of the Society or Exhibitor wishing to lodge a protest in respect of any animal exhibited or any breach of the society's regulations must do so in person and in writing by 3pm on Showday, before any animals are allowed to leave and obtain a written acknowledgement from the Secretary by this time. A deposit of £5 shall at the same time be paid which will be forfeited to the Society if on investigation the protest is not sustained. This rule does not debar the council from taking action in respect of any irregularities which may come to its knowledge at any time.
7. No person who is proven to the satisfaction of Council to have been excluded from competing for prizes or attempted to obtain a prize by a false certificate or other unfair means at the Exhibition of a Society and no person who is known or proved to be under suspension from any Society for fraudulent practices shall be allowed to exhibit at the Show. Any animal not being bona-fide sold will automatically be disqualified.
8. The council will not hold itself responsible for any loss of accident whatsoever that may occur on the Showground and all entries are deemed to be made on this understanding.
9. Order of judging will be as shown in the catalogue unless otherwise notified on showday.
10. Livestock wagons must be parked in correct area as indicated and all animals must be installed in order to be on view to the public otherwise prize money will be forfeited at the discretion of the stewards.
11. The Society reserves the right to postpone, cancel, abandon, or curtail the Show due to force majeure or otherwise at its absolute discretion. In no circumstances shall the Society be liable, in contract, tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty) or otherwise howsoever, and whatsoever the cause thereof (i) for any loss of profit, business, contracts, revenues, or anticipated savings, or (ii) for any special indirect or consequential damage or losses of any nature whatsoever. For the purposes of this Condition, '*Force Majeure*' means fire, explosion, flood, lightning, Act of God, act of terrorism, war, rebellion, riot, sabotage, or official strike or similar official labour dispute, or events or circumstances outside the reasonable control of the Society
